Presenter's Biography

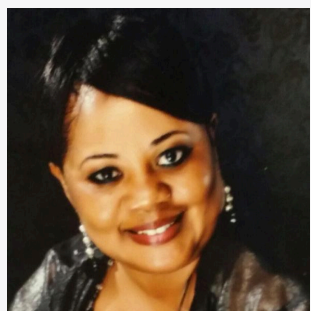
