Presenter's Biography

O'Violet J. Oree



O'Violet J. Oree grew up in Dale, SC. In 1973 she started college life at Baptist College at Charleston, SC. In April 1974, during her first year she received personal salvation. While yet a college student, she met her husband through a friend at the College of Charleston. They met in a revival where she and a lot of other college girls were lifting up the name of Jesus. They were married in August of 1976 and have five wonderful children, who are living prosperous lives of their own.

After receiving a Bachelors of Science Degree at Baptist College at Charleston, now Southern University, she obtained a Master Degree in the Art of Teaching from the College of Charleston. For many years O'Violet has worn many hats and continues being trained in ministry and early child care. In 2009 she and her husband received their Honorary Doctoral Degrees from Grace Hill Bible College. After a brief six months, O'Violet spent several years directing her own childcare business in North Charleston and Adams Run Children Academy in Adams Run, SC. She closed her personal childcare center in 2016, but still helps in Adams Run. For 31 years O'Violet assisted her husband in pastoring House of God, Miracle Temple, but for the past four years she has been co-pastor while he has been back and forth on mission in Miami, Florida. She no longer has to punch the clock, but as the Lord told her, she works from home. Working from home involves the church, Adams Run Civic Center, PATT, personal property, her desires, and family. To her, the future looks promising.

Deborah Dawson




